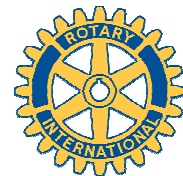
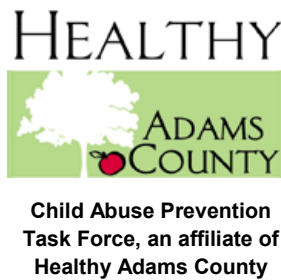
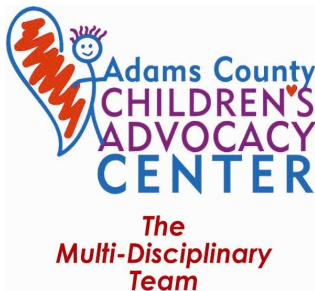

Interviewing the Child Sexual Abuse Perpetrator - The core principals of perpetrator interrogation will also be discussed. From typology to criminal thinking distortions, the more we understand about how the “Perp” thinks the easier it is to get him to talk to us. The more he talks, the more likely it is he will make incriminating statements. A multi-step guide to interrogation will be discussed, and videotape interrogation will be reviewed and analyzed.

Sex Offenders – The training will discuss the use of the internet by child predators, child pornography collectors, child molester behavior, and the role of ICE in child exploitation investigations.

Series C1 – Community Members

Presented by Ryan Hoover

Who are Sex Offenders in our Communities? – This training will present the challenging task faced by law enforcement in the supervision and rehabilitation of sexual offenders. This presentation will discuss the difficulties identifying sexual offenders as well as the daunting task of protecting the community from sexual offenders. The presenter will also discuss the collaborative effort of law enforcement, social service agencies, and the community, in combating the issues surrounding sexual offenders.

Use of Polygraph in Child Abuse Investigations - The use of polygraph or “lie detector” as people often refer to it, was primarily designed to be a scientific aid to interrogation. The results of the polygraph test are by no means conclusive evidence, but admissions and confessions obtained as a result of a polygraph examination are. This workshop will discuss the valuable role of a criminal polygraph examiner in child abuse investigations and how they can be utilized. Case examples will be discussed.

Sexting & Cyberbullying – This training will focus on the challenges of today’s teenagers and their interaction with the cyber world. Children have discovered new and more damaging techniques to bully each other. Children have killed each other and committed suicide after incidents of cyberbullying. Sexting is a disturbing new trend of teenage flirting. The sending of nude or semi-nude photos of themselves via electronic media has become all too common. The sobering fact is that 71% of teenage girls and 67% of teenage boys have sent sexually suggestive content to another individual. This presentation will explore tips for preventing and responding to cyberbullying and sexting.

Series A4 – Advanced Investigation Topics

Presented by Kathleen Janson and Chief James C. Childs III of Southern Regional Police Department

Vicarious Trauma: The Cost of Caring - Professionals who are called upon to assist families in crisis easily recognize the immediate and long-term impact that trauma has on the individuals they serve. Most, however, underestimate the impact that working with families in crisis has on their own professional life, personal life, or the lives of their colleagues. This workshop will address the obvious and the not-so-obvious effects of vicarious traumatization, how to recognize it in yourself, your relationships and your co-workers and, more importantly, what to do about it.

Series B4 – Basic Investigations Topics

Presented by Kimberly Duffy, ACCAC and Jen McNew, SANE Nurse

Minimal Facts & the SANE Nurse Protocol for the Child Abuse Investigator – This training is designed for the first responder who does not typically handle child abuse investigations or is new to the field. Participants will learn how to appropriately talk to a child to gather the basic information needed to start the investigative process.

The SANE nurse will be providing information on what to expect in the emergency room, when to bring the victim to the emergency room and information regarding the evidence collection kit. You will be able to discover the answers to some of these questions while performing the minimal facts interview. You will be working along with the SANE nurse to gain the proper information regarding the case to reach the best outcome for the victim.

Series C4 – Community Topics

Presented by Shelly Duckworth, ACCAC

Healthy Boundaries and Behaviors: Talking to your Children – Early relationships play a pivotal role in the lives of adolescents and are important to developing the capacity for long-term, committed relationships into adulthood. The quality of adolescent romantic relationships can have long-lasting effects on self-esteem and shape personal values regarding romance, intimate relationships, and sexuality. This workshop will explore the basic tenants of a healthy adolescent relationship and identify potential dangers related to adolescent involvement in unhealthy relationships. Strategies for promoting healthy relationships among adolescents will be discussed and participants will leave with activities they can utilize to talk with adolescents about the importance of healthy relationships.

Presenters' Bios

Detective Mike Johnson - Featured Speaker

Detective Johnson's career in law enforcement began in 1982, and he is currently assigned to the Juvenile Division Unit of the Plano Police Department. He is founding member of the Collin County Children's Advocacy Center, and in 1996 he was named the Center's "Child Advocate of the Year." Mike was appointed to the National Board of Directors for the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children (APSAC) in 1998, and was President of the APSAC Texas State Chapter. In addition to serving on numerous national boards and task forces, including the National Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, the Law Enforcement Subcommittee for several of APSAC's National Colloquiums, and the Working Group for the establishment of the National Center on the Sexual Behavior of Youth (NCSBY), Mike has been instrumental in helping Sexual Offender Protocol Task Force and Senator Florence Shapiro's Blue Ribbon committee to formulate the now instated "Ashley Laws."

Shelly Duckworth

Ms. Duckworth is a Mental Health Counselor, Certified Trauma Specialist, Certified Pennsylvania PTSD Group Facilitator, and Certified Family Life Educator. She is currently pursuing her doctorate in counseling psychology. She also has graduate experience in family therapy and has been involved in the field of victim advocacy for over 10 years. Shelly's responsibilities at the Adams County Children's Advocacy Center include assessments, trauma based therapy services, play therapy, structured sensory interventions and cognitive behavioral therapy with children and their families that have been referred through the Center. She also provides group therapy services, prevention programs, community education through trainings and consults with Multidisciplinary Team members regarding clinical components of referred cases.

Tim Duff

Mr. Duff has over thirty years working with juveniles as a Chief of Campus Police, Juvenile Probation Officer and working with juveniles and families as a pastoral counselor. He holds a B.A. in Psychology from McDaniel College and a M.S. in Criminal Justice Administration from Shippensburg University. He is a member of the national gang task force. He received training in cyber crimes and is certified to teach On-Line Safety. Mr. Duff has presented at several regional and state conferences on Juvenile Justice.

Kimberly Duffy

Ms. Duffy has a Masters Degree in Social Work from Marywood University and a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Work from Millersville University as well as over 13 years of experience working directly with children. Kim serves as the Adams County Children's Advocacy Center Forensic Interviewer and plays a critical role in abuse investigations with training in the National Children's Advocacy Center and Cornerhouse models of Forensic Interviewing. She has worked as a Caseworker and Casework Supervisor for the Adams County Children & Youth Services and has been dedicating herself to the children of this county since 1997. Kim is also a licensed Social Worker.

Kristi Field

Ms. Fields has 20 years combined experience working in the mental health and Juvenile Justice field, most of which have been as a Juvenile Probation Officer with Adams County. She has a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from Shippensburg University. She has been certified to teach On-Line Safety and presented at several local conferences and schools. She is an active member in the Adams Coalition to Prevent Teen Pregnancy, the Child Abuse Task Force and the Domestic Violence Task Force.

Detective Aaron Holladay

Detective Holladay has sixteen years of law enforcement experience. He received his BA from George Fox University. He was the Deputy Sheriff with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office in Ventura, California 1994-1998 and is currently a member of the Vancouver Police Department. He has been assigned as a detective to the Arthur D. Curtis Children's Justice Center since 2000. He conducts investigations of alleged felony physical & sex abuse cases. His primary duties as an investigator are to conduct forensic interviews of children, witnesses and suspects, prepare search warrants, gather evidence, etc. Detective Holladay is also a certified Criminal Polygraph Examiner and a member of the American Polygraph Association, American Association of Police Polygraphists, and Northwest Polygraph Examiners Association.

Ryan Hoover

Mr. Hoover received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice at Shippensburg University. He has been employed by Adams County Adult Probation since August 2002 where he has supervised sexual offenders for the entire time. He has 175 hours of training in the sexual offender field ranging from victim interviewing to offender supervision. He is a member of the multidisciplinary team with the Children's Advocacy Center since 2006. He assisted in tracking registered sexual offenders that are on his caseload by having them register and keeping in compliance with Megan's Law. Mr. Hoover has dedicated his short career to victim safety and protecting our community.

Kathleen Jansen

Dr. Jansen is a licensed psychologist specializing in the treatment of trauma. Dr. Jansen is a graduate of the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, and currently works for Wellspan as the clinical supervisor of the psychiatric inpatient unit at York Hospital. She coordinates the South Central Pennsylvania Critical Incident Stress Management Team, which provides crisis intervention services to police, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel following traumatic incidents. Dr. Jansen also provides disaster medical health services for the American Red Cross DSHR and has responded to several national disasters.

Special Agent Craig LeCadre

Agent LeCadre works for the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General in Education and Outreach. He has been in this position for 2 years and with the Attorney General's office for the past 9 years. He gave 14 years of service to the Harrisburg Bureau of Police. Some of his honors include Officer of the Year with the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives in 1993, Officer of the Optimist Club in 1996, and numerous awards for meritorious service to the city of Harrisburg.

Jennifer McNew

Ms. McNew is 2004 graduate of Shepherd University where she obtained a degree in nursing. She has been employed by the Gettysburg Hospital since then as a registered nurse in the emergency room. Ms. McNew became a SANE (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner) in 2005 and has been working as a SANE since then in Adams County and in Franklin County since January 2009. She is the SANE Team coordinator for the Gettysburg Hospital Emergency Room. Ms. McNew will also be providing the medical exams on children at the CAC beginning this spring.

Louis Morlier

Mr. Morlier otherwise known as "Chip" is a criminal investigator (special agent) with the Office of Investigations, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, Department of Homeland Security. He is also an adjunct professor of criminal justice at Penn State Harrisburg. Agent Morlier has been in law enforcement for 20 years, and investigates human trafficking and internet child exploitation for the Department of Homeland Security.

D. Jo Sterner

Ms. Sterner joined PCADV as a Training Specialist in 1988. Prior to that she was employed as Coordinator at Dauphin County District Attorney's Child Abuse Prosecution Unit. She also served as the Director of the Greater Harrisburg Area YWCA's Rape Crisis & Domestic Violence unit for over 11 years. She was a consultant for Community Research Associates, Inc. under contract with the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance and Office of Victims of Crime to provide state and local jurisdictions with training and technical assistance in preventing and combating drug-related and violence crime to improve the function of the criminal justice system. She was an instructor at the HACC Police Academy for approximately 8 years on domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and child abuse. She is also a trainer for the Pennsylvania Child Welfare Training Program.

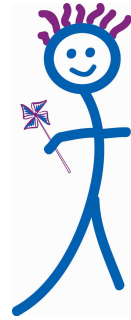

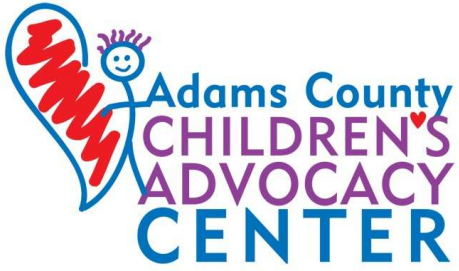
